TUITION GRANT FOR FUTURE J&W STUDENTS

Students who successfully complete the Career Explorations[®] program will receive a one-time only \$500 tuition grant as part of any financial aid award they may receive if accepted to J&W. The tuition grant applies toward the first year of study at J&W. Only one grant will be awarded per student, regardless of the number of programs a student previews. To be eligible for this grant, the student must mail his/her reservation deposit for the September in which he/she will be enrolling by March 1 of the same year.

NOTE: ACCESS students participating in Career Explorations[®] will receive a \$250 grant in their freshman year and a \$250 grant in their sophomore year at J&W.

BAKING & PASTRY ARTS

Explore a career as a baker or pastry chef through the University's International Baking & Pastry Institute[®]. In this hands-on laboratory class, you will learn to produce mini-pastries, cakes and petit fours, as well as participate in hands-on pastry demonstrations.

BAKING & PASTRY ARTS — ADVANCED

This program is for students who have more than six months of vocational or professional food service experience. It offers an in-depth look at the production of enticing desserts through hands-on demonstrations, with a focus on the components of an a-la-minute plated dessert.

CULINARY ARTS

Our world renowned College of Culinary Arts was the first to offer bachelor's degrees in both Culinary Arts and Culinary Nutrition. Through hands-on experience and demonstrations, you will be introduced to basic culinary practices. Laboratory experience will include the basic skills of sautéing, grilling and baking.

CULINARY ARTS — ADVANCED

This program is for students who have more than six months of vocational or professional food service experience. It offers a more advanced preview that includes Cooking Techniques and Regional Cuisine.

CULINARY ARTS WEEK-LONG PROGRAM

This program is for students who have completed their junior year of high school with at least one academic year of food service or lodging management experience, with a "B" average and 3.0 overall cumulative GPA. J&W's finest chef instructors will offer you hands-on training in a variety of culinary techniques. You'll be taught how to prepare recipes and learn the importance of safety and sanitation, all while working with state-of-the-art equipment in J&W labs. Students who complete this program will receive the ServSafe certificate. Space is limited, so register early. **(You must provide your own transportation for this special program.)**

FLY-IN OPTION

Students who live more than a six-hour drive from the campus of their choice, but within the continental U.S. are eligible to fly to that campus for the program. This option is an additional \$200 per person. All arrangements will be made by the University on your behalf. Direct flights are not guaranteed. Round trip flights are booked based upon availability and program parameters. If you have any questions about this option, please call the campus you plan to visit.

REGISTRATION AND COST

Registration forms must be received no later than two weeks before the scheduled program dates (no later than four weeks for the Charlotte Campus); please note: registration forms for the Fly-In Option and for the Culinary Arts Week-long Program are due **FOUR WEEKS** before the scheduled program dates (no later than six weeks for the Charlotte Campus).

Registrations will not be taken over the phone. A parent's signature is required for each participant under the age of 18.



The Culinary Arts and Baking & Pastry Arts programs cost \$195 per student. The Culinary Arts Week-long Program costs \$595. All other programs cost \$95. All program costs include instructional materials, accommodations for two nights, all meals upon arrival, city and campus tours, and extracurricular activities. Rooming requests will be honored on a first-received, first-served basis. All accommodations are based on double occupancy. Transportation during the program is provided. Any participant arranging his/her own air transportation to campus who requires ground transportation from airport to program must fax flight itinerary to the Admissions Events Office two weeks prior to the program.

Confirmation of program registration, dates and reporting time will be mailed to you upon receipt of payment. A certificate presentation and breakfast is held on the last day of the program. Up to four people may accompany a participant to the breakfast without additional cost. Breakfast confirmation will be included in the confirmation packet.

Registration cancellations should be sent in writing to the Admissions Events Office. A full refund will be given if the request is received at least two weeks prior to the start of the program. If a reservation is cancelled after airline tickets have been purchased by the University, the participant is required to reimburse the University for the entire cost of the airline ticket(s). **THE UNIVERSITY RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CANCEL ANY PROGRAM DUE TO INSUFFICIENT ENROLLMENT.** In such cases, full program fee is refundable. The University assumes no responsibility for any other expenses incurred due to cancellation of a program.

ONE OPTION FOR JUNIORS: ACCESS

In J&W's ACCESS program, high school seniors attend J&W during their senior year of high school and earn college credit while meeting their high school graduation requirements. They get to be a J&W student, but still attend the high school events they normally would. ACCESS students also receive a 50 percent tuition savings for their first year at J&W. For more information, call the campus where you plan to enroll or inquire when you attend Career Explorations®.

In order to effectively administer limited financial aid funds, Johnson & Wales University has adopted an institutional policy whereby the total of all University-funded or administered monies awarded to a single student may not exceed a specific dollar amount during an academic year. This amount is determined prior to each year's financial aid awarding process.
