New International Student Report-In

All international students upon arrival to Providence need to report to the International Center located at 274 Pine Street, Downcity campus. In compliance with U.S. government regulations, Johnson & Wales University will review and photocopy your passport, student visa, I-94 card, and I-20. It is mandatory that you present all of these documents to International Center staff.

Obtaining Your Student ID

Our campus is a locked campus — meaning that you need a student ID to gain entrance to our buildings.

To obtain your student ID card, please email your complete name, student ID number, and photo to ldapictures.pvd@jwu.edu

Your student ID number, which starts with a "J", is located on the right hand side of your acceptance letter. It is also listed on your I-20 comment line. You must indicate that you are a **graduate international student**.

Your student ID will be printed in advance and will be ready for pick-up when you arrive on campus. The picture should be in one of the following formats; .jpeg, .bmp or .gif.

Note: You must have a schedule before an ID can be printed.
