2009 PREVIEW

After a solid 24 win season in 2008 the Johnson & Wales baseball program is looking to continue its growth in 2009. A GNAC Championship and NCAA bid are very realistic goals for this year's Wildcats. The 2008 squad made it 7 straight years of 20 plus wins for the Wildcat program. The 'Cats will have to replace the big hole left by the graduation of Brad Jackson, Josh Hodge, Erik Hufnagel, Mike MacKay, Mike Manley, Chad Miller, Mike Ziman and Mike Wengzn.

The bulk of last year's team remains intact with 15 letter winners returning. Some talented newcomers will mix with this year's solid veteran core to make the club's depth its strength. As always, Coach John LaRose will stress pitching and defense as the keys to a GNAC championship. On the mound, JWU is led by senior Bobby Gilbert and juniors Jeff Jordan and Nick Marine. Returnees Mike Morgan, Mike Toussaint and Rich Fonseca will bring much needed experience to the mound. Newcomers Mike Wood, John MacKay, Matt Yaeger, Derek Nesbitt, and Marc Sommerhalter will fill roles as both starting and relief pitchers.

The infield has a very strong core group returning. Frank Nadjavestky and Rich Fonseca return as veteran middle infielders. Also veterans John Kuschman, Mike Murphy and Teddy Katz are back to anchor the infield. Adding depth to the infield will be talented newcomers Nick Alosco, Cory Ryan, and Chris DePalma. Behind the plate will be a talented group. Returning starter Eric Rapuano along with newcomers Joe Coppola and Bill Dragon bring a ton of talent behind the plate for the Wildcats. The key to a solid defense is a strong "dishman" and JWU should be in good hands with these three. They have an excellent understanding of LaRose's defensive concept and are the quarterbacks of the Wildcat defense.

Athletic, versatile and gifted describes the outfield. Senior Justin Maldonado and junior Waldis Garcia will lead the group. Returner Mike Sarfati and newcomers Justin Nerney, Matt Yaeger, and Alex Verrecchia will give LaRose numerous options when filling out the outfield line up. The expectations are very high for this group.

Versatility should be the strength of this year's offense. The core group returns from a team that hit a formidable .305 in 2008. The Wildcats averaged 6.4 runs per game in 2008. Rapuano, Kuschman, Nadjavestky and Maldonado will spearhead the very able crew this year.

Fans of Wildcat baseball are going to have an exciting spring. The foundation of the program continues to strengthen. Once again, JWU will start the season in Florida, and then play their GNAC and New England portion of the schedule. The 2009 Baseball 'Cats plan to conclude the season battling for a GNAC Championship.

LaRose begins his tenth year as the head coach of JWU. In his nine years the Wildcats have won a record amount of games, won a GNAC regular season championship, and put JWU on the map for baseball. This year's Wildcat team promises to be another competitive group.

Coach has his roots in Rhode Island baseball. His coaching career has gone from North Smithfield High School, West Warwick Post Two (with A.D. John Parente), and then to the University of Rhode Island as a pitching coach. His playing career included an Academic All – Big East senior year at Providence College and an All-State selection at Shea High School in Pawtucket, RI.

JWU ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME MEMBERS

TOM BORGIA - Inducted May 10th 2004

When baseball games were on the line there wasn't a better person to have in the lineup than Tom Borgia. The 1st baseman from Maple Shade, NJ, was a consistent clutch performer on four of JWU's early teams. Named to the All GNAC first team in 1998 & 1999, he was an all league second pick in 1997 and an all tournament selection for three straight years. Borgia's career fielding percentage was a gaudy .990. He made only 8 errors in 780 chances during his entire career. Hitting .426 in 1998 with a slugging percentage of .657, he was also named the MVP in the 1998 tournament, in which the Wildcats won the GNAC title. With over 100 hits in his career, Borgia was a .379 hitter.

MARK DEVEAUX - Inducted May 12th 2003

The most prolific scorer in the history of Johnson & Wales University ice hockey, Canadian Mark Deveaux was also one of the universities most accomplished baseball players. Playing for JWU for three seasons, he was named All GNAC first team in 1997 and the 1998 championship season. An outstanding defensive outfielder, Deveaux hit .395 in 1997 and was also an all tournament selection.

ROSS WILMOT - Inducted May 13th 2002

Versatility, excellence, and class marked the academic and athletic careers of Ross Wilmot. A three time member of the GNAC's all-academic team, he was also an all league selection in both baseball and soccer. A three-sport standout at Glassboro (New Jersey) High, Wilmot's impact was immediate at JWU. Wilmot hit .323 and knocked in 25 runs while pitching his was to an All GNAC first team. A conference second team in baseball in 1997, also was a part of the GNAC champions in 1998 on the mound pitching and at shortstop.

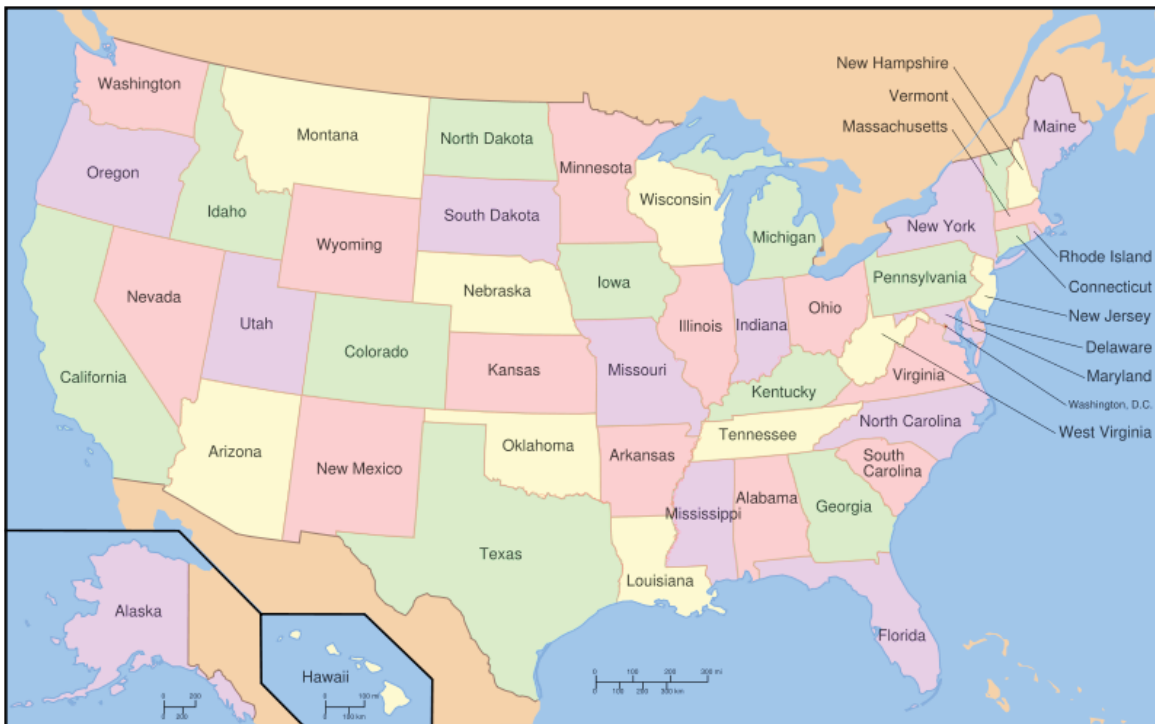
ROB ECCLESTON - Inducted May 13th 2002

Truly one of the great baseball players in the first five years of the GNAC history, Rob Eccleston was leadership and determination personified. A diminutive 5'7 native of New Bedford, MA, fashioned a history of firsts on the diamond for JWU. First to play over 100 career games, first to reach 100 hits, and score over 100 runs in an NCAA career at JWU, "Ecc" was also one of the leaders of an 1998 team that captured the institutions first GNAC baseball championship. In the first year of conference play (96) Eccleston was named all-league at 2nd base. In 1997, after hitting .356 with 42 hits, he was named to the All GNAC first team. One year later he won his second all league first team award, after hitting .346 with with 46 hits. A brilliant fielder, Eccleston made all but 18 plays in his last 320 chances at 2nd base over the last two years of his career.
