PROGRAM DETAILS

The Brighthouse Fellows (BHF) program will award up to \$2,000 to each of the 10 qualifying students in the program for up to two years. Scholarships will be awarded on a year-to-year basis and renewal is contingent upon the student continuing to meet the GPA requirement.

ELIGIBILITY

BHF applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Earn a high school GPA of 3.5 or higher and top 20% ranking in their high school class
- Enroll in an undergraduate program offered on the JWU Charlotte Campus
- Participate in the JWU Honors Program
