The purpose of this agreement is to provide a smooth transition between the evaluated academic programs by:  
Identifying all required and equivalent courses for the relevant programs at each institution, and  
Facilitating credit transfer for students who meet the agreed upon criteria.

1. Students enrolling in this program must meet all Johnson & Wales University admissions requirements
2. This articulation applies to the JWU Liberal Studies, Political Science, and Criminal Justice majors **only**.
3. The Program requires six years of full-time equivalency study.
4. Students will matriculate at RWU once they have met the following requirements and been formally admitted to RWU:
  - i. completion of at least 135 quarter credits at JWU with an overall minimum GPA of 3.2;
  - ii. completion of at least 135 quarter credits without having received a grade below “C” in any course;
  - iii. an LSAT score that is at or above the median accepted score for RWU for the previous year;
  - iv. a satisfactory “character and fitness” review upon making formal application to RWU;
  - v. an in-person appointment with the Dean of Admissions at RWU to discuss program requirements.
5. Students who have been admitted to RWU as part of the Program will receive a Bachelor's degree from JWU once they have met the degree requirements of JWU.
6. Students will receive a J.D. from RWU once the prescribed requirements of that program have been met.
